The house was fully renovated but keeping all the architectural elements and respecting the structure and the appearance of the original house.

This family also runs a bio-orchard next to the guest house.

The products that they have to purchase are obtained from the local producers (Hallumi cheese, Carob syrup, eggs, flour, etc)

Their amazing breakfast is fully house made and organic, from products of their own garden. It brings to their place hosts from near accommodations.

They compost their food leftovers to fertilize their orchard

She bakes her own bread, cakes and and pastries









Interactive Activities:

Practical Activity 1

Objective: The aim of this study is to emphasize the significance of conceptualization and vision development in the design of agritourism projects.

Preparation: Prior to the activity, ensure that participants are equipped with necessary materials, including magazines, newspapers, glue, scissors, and large poster boards or paper. **Activity Description:** Participants will be instructed to engage in the creation of a vision board for a hypothetical agritourism project. Discussion: Once all participants have concluded their presentations on their respective vision boards, facilitate a discussion regarding the significance of a clearly articulated vision in ensuring the success of an agritourism endeavour. Please explain how this activity aligns with the training module's focus on conceptualization and vision development.

Practical Activity 2

Objective: To simulate the process of making decisions on sustainable practises while designing agritourism projects.

Preparation: Create a set of scenario cards that outline various situations or decisions pertaining to sustainability within an agritourism project. Please ensure that an adequate number of cards is prepared to accommodate each individual participant or group.

Activity Description: Participants will be informed that they will be participating in a simulation exercise focused on sustainability scenarios. The individuals will be required to make decisions that align with the sustainability principles that were covered in the training module.

Procedure:

- **1.** Please allocate participants into smaller groups or pairs, and distribute a set of scenario cards to each group.
- 2. Participants are required to make informed decisions regarding their responses and actions in order to promote sustainability within their agritourism project.
- 3. Promote active dialogue and collaborative decision-making among the groups, with a particular focus on highlighting the significance of sustainable practises.
- 4. Following a predetermined time frame, such as 10 minutes, each group will proceed to present their selected actions and provide a comprehensive rationale to the entire group.

Card Scenarios:

Waste Management: Situation: Your agritourism project produces a substantial quantity of waste on a daily basis, which includes food scraps, packaging materials, and items associated with guest activities. What strategies would you employ to effectively manage and mitigate waste in order to minimise the environmental impact of your project?

Water Conservation: Situation: Your agritourism site is currently experiencing a shortage of water, and you are tasked with determining the most effective approach to conserve water while still meeting the needs of your guests. What steps would you implement to promote responsible water consumption?

Energy Efficiency: Scenario: The success of your project is dependent on the availability of energy for multiple purposes, including heating accommodations and powering equipment. What strategies can be implemented to enhance energy efficiency and decrease energy consumption without compromising guest comfort?

Local Sourcing: Scenario: You are faced with the decision of whether to procure products and supplies from suppliers located far away, which would result in lower costs, but also lead to an increase in the project's carbon footprint. What strategic choices would you implement to give priority to local sourcing and foster community support?

Wildlife Conservation: Situation: Your agritourism venture is situated in a region abundant with a variety of wildlife species. What strategies would you employ to effectively design and manage the site in order to safeguard local wildlife habitats and mitigate disruptions to the ecosystem?

Cultural Sensitivity: Scenario: The objective of your project is to actively involve the local community and promote awareness and appreciation of its cultural heritage. How can one ensure that their activities and interactions are conducted in a manner that is culturally sensitive and respectful?

Seasonal fluctuations: Situation: Your agritourism enterprise encounters notable variations in the number of guests throughout different seasons. How would you modify your operational strategies to ensure sustainability and foster community involvement during periods of high and low demand?





Biodiversity Enhancement: Situation: You have the opportunity to introduce a novel plant or animal species to your project; however, it is important to consider the potential implications it may have on the local ecosystem. What factors would you consider when determining whether to introduce a particular species?

Transportation Consideration: Situation: A significant number of your visitors depend on transportation in order to access your agritourism destination. How can we promote environmentally friendly transportation choices and minimise the ecological consequences of guest travel?

Educational Initiatives: Scenario: Our project aims to provide educational programmes, but we are currently seeking guidance on selecting appropriate topics and implementing effective engagement methods to ensure visitor satisfaction. What educational initiatives would you propose to enhance awareness of sustainability and foster appreciation for local culture?



Tips and suggestions:

Encourage participants to consult local farmers, environmentalists, and cultural preservationists. Building strong relationships with these specialists can lead to agritourism project collaboration and insights.

- Prioritise sustainability certifications like Green Globe or Rainforest Alliance to emphasise eco-labels. An agritourism project might gain legitimacy and attract eco-conscious tourists with these certifications.
- Community Engagement: Highlighting the benefits of local community involvement in project design and execution. I suggest holding community meetings or workshops to gather input and support the initiative for long-term success.
- Emphasize the importance of ongoing customer service, sustainability, and cultural sensitivity training for personnel. A skilled team can greatly improve guest service.
- Guest Education: Participants are encouraged to teach guests through guided tours, workshops, and interactive experiences. These programmes teach tourists about local culture, the environment, and sustainability.
- Suggestion: Regular environmental audits should assess the agritourism project's influence on the local ecosystem. This technique can uncover opportunities for improvement and demonstrate sustainability.
- Recommend participants allocate budget funds to sustainability. This may incorporate renewable energy, waste reduction, and habitat restoration.





- Collaboration: We advocate partnering with adjacent restaurants, artisan stores, and transportation providers to create a network of services that improve guest experience and boost the local economy.
- A well-designed website and active social media profiles are essential for online presence. Online marketing and customer engagement can improve reservations and audience size.
- Guest comments Loop: Participants should actively seek guest comments and suggestions for development. Continuously collecting and analysing feedback can improve the project.
- Emergency preparedness: Stress the importance of evacuation, first-aid, and communication preparations. Safety is paramount for guests and the environment.
- Keep participants informed of market trends and customer preferences. Promote flexible agritourism practises to meet evolving guest expectations.
- I suggest gift shops sell eco-friendly and locally sourced products. These things can help the project's sustainability goals and give guests souvenirs.
- Objective: Encourage participants to focus on project sustainability beyond financial rewards. Sustainable practises and community engagement can help agritourism succeed.

For peer networking, encourage participants to join agritourism networks, associations, and conferences. Sharing expertise and experiences with peers can help a project develop.
